Background of PPSG Money:

The government has provided additional funding of £150 million per annum to improve the provision of physical education (PE) and sport in primary schools. This funding - provided jointly by the Departments for Education, Health and Culture, Media and Sport - has been allocated to primary school head teachers. This funding is ring-fenced and can only be spent on provision of PE and sport in schools.

Summary of PPSG 2022 - 2023

Objectives of Spending PPSG:

- To improve the physical play provision of PE at Brook Infant School through raising staff confidence and equipping them with more effective and specialised skills and equipment in certain physical activities.
- To develop the profile of physical activity throughout the school.
- To give all children the opportunity to experience different sports/physical activities and become interested in the new sports/physical activities offered.
- To develop a love of sport and physical activity.
- To encourage children to develop into healthy adults.
- To support children's gross and fine motor skills and to enable the development of the shoulder and pelvic girdle.
- To support the development of rhythm and timing in movement activities, such as music and movement and dance.
- To be able to support the sensory needs of many children.
