

Dear Parents and Carers,

Since April 2015 free entitlement providers are able to claim extra funding through the Early Years Pupil Premium (EYPP) to support children's development, learning and care. The EYPP provides roughly an extra 53p per hour for eligible 3 and 4 year old children.

This extra money allows nurseries to support those EYPP children in a variety of ways both in nursery and out. For example, it could be for extra support with their learning in nursery, or it may be towards resources to develop skills or next steps. We work closely with parents to look at how best to support each individual child.

The criteria for the EYPP is that your family must be in receipt of:

- Universal Credit with an annual net earned income of no more than £7400
- Income Support
- Income-based Jobseekers Allowance
- Income-related Employment and Support Allowance
- Support under Part 6 of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999
- Guarantee Element of State Pension Credit
- Working Tax Credit run-on (paid for the four weeks after you stop qualifying for Working Tax Credit)
- \bullet Child Tax Credit (with no Working Tax Credit) with an annual income of no more than £16,190

In order for us to apply for the Early Years Pupil Premium on your behalf you will need to ensure that the section called 'Details of Parent/Carer for my child named above' on your parent declaration form is complete. This includes your date of birth, full name and national insurance number or national asylum support service number. We can only apply for you if all these details are correct and complete.
