


# TAKE A CLOSER LOOK!

will fly back to China ourselves to celebrate Chinese New Year. This year it is the year of the Ox.


# Junk modelling


After looking through the images of France on Monday, can you choose your favourite landmark from France and re create it with junk modelling?

### ICT


Explore the BBC Bitesize geography zone and see if you can find out anymore information about France or UK.

## Chinese New Year

In school we will be celebrating Chines New Year by making paper lanterns and Chinese dragons. Why don't you have a go!



# How to make a paper lantern:



- 1. Cut off one end of the paper, Set aside to use as the handle.
- 2. Decorate the sheet using coloured pens, paint or glitter.
- 3. Fold your paper in half lengthwise along the dashed line.
- 4. Cut the marked lines along the sheet. (Do not cut to the edge of the paper).
- 5. Unfold the paper.
- 6. Match the long edges together on the lantern and use tape to hold it in place.
- 7. Staple the handle to the top of the lantern.

Why not try printing the template onto coloured paper?
