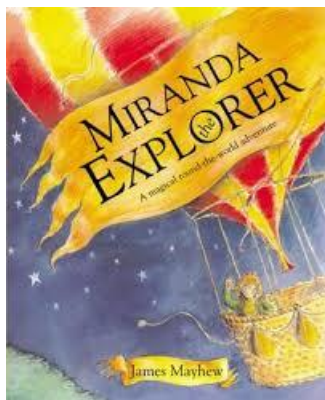

Roll a die to move along the board. Say the word you land on. If you don't know the word, move back.

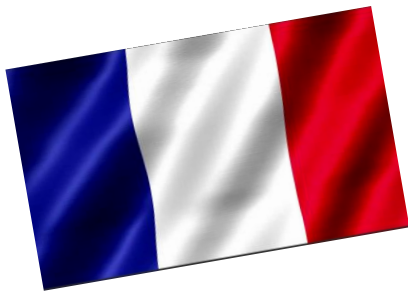

ICT

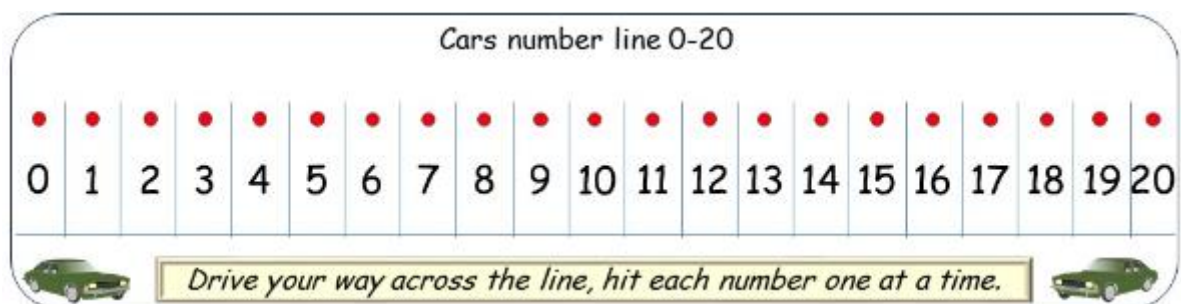
Explore the BBC Bitesize geography zone and see if you can find out anymore information about France or UK.

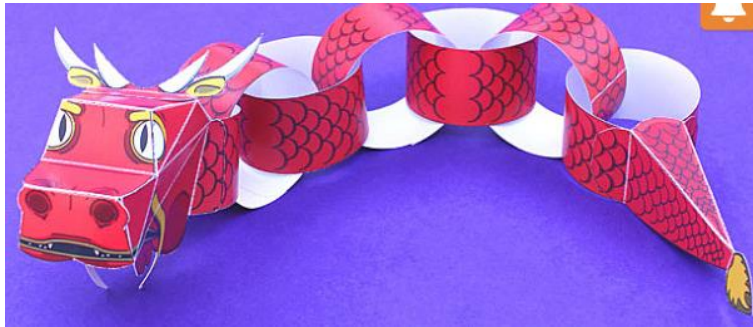
Race backwards from 20.

Chinese New Year

In school we will be celebrating Chinese New Year by making paper lanterns and Chinese dragons. Why don't you have a go!



How to make a paper lantern:

1. Cut off one end of the paper. Set aside to use as the handle.
2. Decorate the sheet using coloured pens, paint or glitter.
3. Fold your paper in half lengthwise along the dashed line.
4. Cut the marked lines along the sheet. (Do not cut to the edge of the paper).
5. Unfold the paper.
6. Match the long edges together on the lantern and use tape to hold it in place.
7. Staple the handle to the top of the lantern.

Why not try printing the template onto coloured paper?
